

# *Dawn to Dusk or Sunset to Sunset*

We know that **SATAN** counterfeits everything good that God has.  
Why don't you think the **start of the day** is counterfeited too?

How many hours are there in a **Biblical "Day"**?  
If you said **24 hours**; then why did Christ make the following statement?

**John 11:9 Christ asked:** **"Are there not 12 hours in a day?"**

Shouldn't we use Scriptures to interpret Scriptures? Of course!

In the following Scripture, how many hours are there in a **Biblical day** and in a **night**?

**Gen. 1:5** **"God called the light Day, and He called the darkness Night."** (a 24 hour cycle)

**Jer. 33:20** **"If you can break My covenant with the day and My covenant with the night, so that there will not be day and night in their season."**

**Deu. 12:28** **"Do what is good and right in the sight of Yahuah.**  
<sup>32</sup> **You shall not add to it nor take away from it."**

**Isa. 5:20** **Woe (cursed) to those who put darkness for light, and light for darkness;**

Christ said there is **12 hours** in a **Biblical "day"** and God states there is **12 hours** in a **"day"**.  
Day and night is **a Biblical 24 hour cycle**. We must use Scripture to define Biblical words;  
especially when we have **direct quotes from God**. Day and Night have their own "covenant"  
and "season" and you **shall not add** to any of God's word or **Woe (cursed) to those who** try.

Did you know that the Jews changed the start of the Sabbath day?

***The Jewish Festivals: History & Observance (by Hayyim Schauss - Schocken 1938)***

At The Beginning of the Common Era ... In order **to assure against profanation (reason for the change)** of the Sabbath the **Jews added** the late **Friday afternoon hours** to the **Sabbath** (p. 13) ...The Sabbath in general, thus attained its peak in the first two centuries of the Common Era, the age of the Tannaim (70 A.D. - 200A.D.), as the Jewish teachers and sages of that period were called. However, there were **no Friday Night services as of yet**. ... **Later** it became **customary** to hold communal services in the Synagogue on Friday Night." (p. 15.)
